Dick qualified as an architect in 1965. Since joining Rolfe Judd in 1977, he has been instrumental in the design of many of the practice's most important award-winning buildings, as well as assessing the work of others for the Civic Trust Awards. He became an Associate in 1980 and a Director in 1986.

Dick is committed to producing architecture that relates positively to its context and improves the built environment. He is involved in monitoring and controlling the quality of design output from the office generally. Many of the projects with which he has been involved have been highly acclaimed and widely published.

Projects include:

- **150 New Bond Street** London W1
Client: Prudential Property Investment Managers Ltd
Major redevelopment to provide offices over retail. The scheme replaces an unremarkable 1950s office/retail building.
- **Aybrook Street** London W1
Client: The CIT Group
A major residential development on a complicated urban site in the heart of Westminster, comprising 140 units grouped around a central courtyard.

- **Milton Road** Cambridge
Client: Rockley Dene Homes Ltd
Redevelopment of former school site in north east Cambridge, comprising 80 bed 3 storey care home for the elderly together with 67 private and affordable units.
- **Baskerville House** Birmingham
Client: Targetfollow (Birmingham) Ltd
Major refurbishment and extension of the listed former offices of Birmingham City Council.
- **Northcliffe House** Tudor Street London EC4
Client: Hillstone Corporation
Redevelopment of the former printing houses of the Daily Mail and Evening Standard, providing 16,750m² of new office space, together with restaurant and café.
- **Christ Church Court** London EC4
Client: Pillar Property Plc / Stanhope Plc / Prudential Property Investment Managers Ltd
Major new headquarters building adjacent to St Paul's Cathedral, designed in conjunction with the Paternoster Square master plan for the area.
- **Petershill** London EC4
Client: MEPC UK Ltd
Design of buildings and landscape proposals for a major mixed-use development, adjacent to St Paul's Cathedral, comprising offices and a restaurant.
- **Thistle Hotels** St. Albans
Client: Curzon Hotels Ltd
90 bed extension to existing Thistle Hotel with new Conference Centre and public rooms set in landscaped grounds.
- **2-4 Cork Street** London W1
Client: General Accident
1,200m² of new high quality air-conditioned offices, together with a new art gallery at ground and lower ground levels.
- **10 St Bride Street** London EC4
Client: Development Securities
A redevelopment of a prominent site partly in a conservation area. The scheme comprises Cat A offices and a restaurant shell, and includes a section of façade retention.
